

Aboriginal Family, Youth, and Community Engagement

Parental involvement is crucial for the successful promotion of literacy and learning amongst children. This involves the passing of culture, oral traditions, community support, and experiential learning.

Key Ideas:

- Aboriginal family, youth, and community play important roles in the development of literacy and learning.
- A holistic view of family involvement focuses on a mind-body-heart-spirit balance in learning.
- Aboriginal cultures pass knowledge from generation to generation through oral traditions, cultural practices, and experiential learning.
- The lingering impacts of colonization on family involvement in literacy development and learning should be acknowledged.

What practitioners can strive for:

- To provide parents and caregivers access to holistic, culturally relevant resources, services, programs and support that meet their needs and allow them to be involved in literacy and learning.
- To design community literacy programs which provide respect, access, and a safe and secure space for parents and families.
